May 23-26

We began on Saturday with a 3-0 win against Kent and never looked back, losing only one match to Gloucestershire, the eventual runners-up. It could hardly have been predicted. Last year it was only a recovery on the last day that saw us avoid the wooden spoon.

Why this change in fortune? As Jon Watson noted, the first and third pairs were stronger on paper than the opposition and this was reflected in their performance: Jon and Ben at first pair won all their games, mostly by solid margins including a TP by Ben against Hampshire, and the third pair of John and George or Bryan brought up the rear in fine style, losing only two games, one of which they should have won. Howard and Tom or George at second pair had a more difficult job but still managed five wins, which gave us 3-0 victories over

Yorkshire, Wiltshire, Kent and Warwickshire. The highlight came against CA Select when a memorable last turn by Tom won the game to give us the vital 2-1 match win.

There are other factors which are everything to do with the format and nature of the event. Double-banked doubles is time-consuming and often leads to a frantic scramble for the decisive advantage as the minutes ebb away. Nearly all the second and third pairs' games went to time, often being settled by small margins, and this year for the most part they were decided in our favour.

The pressure can bring out the best in players, as noted earlier, but can also lead to all manner of unforced errors, as in the second pair's game against Gloucester when Don Gaunt, having played his first turn with his own ball, was so nonplussed by an expletives-undeleted

outburst at the start of the other game that he then played the first turn with his partner's ball as well.

The Counties is also convivial. The *après croquet* can hamper physical and mental coordination first thing in the morning, and there is also the *pendant croquet* to consider. Not that members of the Bedfordshire team are known to ever (well, hardly ever) indulge in such things themselves.

So, against all the odds, we shall be mixing it with the big boys next year. Congratulations to the team, not forgetting John Wheeler, our non-playing captain and the team's *éminence grise* (or should that be *éminence chauve*?), whose watchful eye and wise words kept us all on course for the title. Constant be, indeed.

The handicaps of the 19 entries varied widely. There were 10 players between -1 (Lionel Tibble) and 5 (John Hall), then five players on 7, three on 16 (including Ray Pearcy and Elaine Newman) and one on 20 (Cliff Hayes). Wrest Park contributed 30% of the entry.

Elaine lost her first game to Eric and was sufficiently stung by this defeat to win her next two +26 and to continue with four more wins and a final defeat at the hands of Geoff Strutt. Eric was also in good form, winning 6/8 to come top of the bottom half (?).

The clear winner was Mike Hills (7) from Northampton, whose only loss in nine games was to Elaine. Of the rest, George Collin and Geoff Strutt both came away with 5/8, Nigel Polhill, John Bee and Wendy Spencer-Smith had 4/8 and Peter Thomson 5/10. Lionel squeezed in 11 games including five wins and three -26 defeats. Cliff Hayes (3/8) was the only player to win or lose all his games by single-figure scores
